

DR. ISAAC FRANCK was a Senior Research Scholar at the Kennedy Institute of Ethics from 1979 to his death in 1985. He turned the Jewish Community Council of Greater Washington into an influential forum on local, national, and international questions during the 25 years that he served as its Executive Vice President. Dr. Franck published research papers in *The Review of Metaphysics*, *The Philosophical Forum*, and other professional journals, as well as in cooperative volumes on aspects on the history of philosophy. He also contributed to current understanding and evaluation of Maimonides and Spinoza. He was a member of the American Philosophical Association, the American Sociological Society, the Association for Jewish Studies, and the National Association for Social Workers.

DR. KENNETH SEESKIN

Kenneth Seeskin received his B.A. from Northwestern in 1968 and his Ph.D. in Philosophy from Yale in 1972. He has been a member of the faculty of Northwestern for over 30 years and currently serves as Chair of the Philosophy Department. He has also served as Director of the Jewish Studies Program (1987-1993), and Director of the Center for the Writing Arts (1996-2002). His publications in Jewish Philosophy include *Jewish Philosophy in a Secular Age*, *Maimonides: a Guide for Today's Perplexed*, *No Other Gods: the Modern Struggle Against Idolatry*, *Searching for a Distant God: The Legacy of Maimonides*, and *Autonomy in Jewish Philosophy*. In 2001 he won the Koret Jewish Book Award for *Searching for a Distant God*. He is currently editing "The Cambridge Companion to Maimonides" and will be coming out with a new book, *Maimonides on the Origin of the World*.

In addition to his many publications, Dr. Seeskin has won numerous teaching awards at Northwestern and was named Charles Deering McCormick Professor of Teaching Excellence from 1995 - 1998. He has lectured to public and professional audiences worldwide on the history and present state of Jewish Philosophy.
