

DR. ISAAC FRANCK was a Senior Research Scholar at the Kennedy Institute of Ethics from 1979 to his death in 1985. He turned the Jewish Community Council of Greater Washington into an influential forum on local, national, and international questions during the 25 years that he served as its Executive Vice President. Dr. Franck published research papers in *The Review of Metaphysics*, *The Philosophical Forum*, and other professional journals, as well as in cooperative volumes on aspects on the history of philosophy. He also contributed to current understanding and evaluation of Maimonides and Spinoza. He was a member of the American Philosophical Association, the American Sociological Society, the Association for Jewish Studies, and the National Association for Social Workers.

## DAVID LUBAN

David Luban is University Professor and Professor of Law and Philosophy at Georgetown's Law Center. His primary interests are legal ethics, international criminal law, and just war theory, and he writes frequently about the war on terror and U.S. torture policy. He received his BA from the University of Chicago and Ph.D. from Yale University, and before coming to Georgetown in 1997 he taught at the University of Maryland and Kent State University. He has been a visiting professor at the Harvard, Stanford, and Yale law schools, and in the philosophy departments of Dartmouth College and Melbourne University. Luban has held Guggenheim and Woodrow Wilson fellowships, and won the Keck and Levy awards for scholarship in legal ethics.

Dr. Luban has published numerous books and articles, most recently *Legal Ethics and Human Dignity* (Cambridge UP, forthcoming in 2007). He writes on legal ethics, legal theory, international criminal law, just war theory, and, most recently, US torture policy.
